Abstract Art is an art movement, formed around the start of the 20th Century by Artists such as Picasso and Kandinsky.

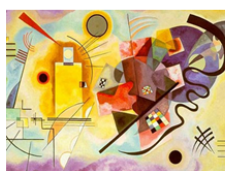
Abstract art is art that does not attempt to represent an accurate depiction of a visual reality but instead use shapes, colours, forms and gestural marks to achieve its effect.

An Art Movement usually refers to a period of time when a group of artists shared common ideas, or approaches and styles, for instance Pop Art or Impressionism.

Abstract art is art that does not attempt to represent an accurate depiction of a visual reality but instead use shapes, colours, forms and gestural marks to achieve its effect.

Abstraction, and Cubism, it can be argued was partly a response to the invention of the camera and it's increasing use to record the world around us, including celebrating and recording major historical events, roles previously taken by Artists

Cubism is an early-20th-century avant-garde art movement that revolutionized European painting and sculpture, and inspired related artistic movements in music, literature, and architecture. In Cubist works of art, the subjects are analysed, broken up, and reassembled in an abstract form—instead of depicting objects from a single perspective, the artist depicts the subject from multiple perspectives to represent the subject in a greater context. Major Cubist artists include Pablo Picasso and Georges Braque.

Expressionism is a style of art, first appearing at start of the 20th century. Typically it present sthe world solely from a subjective perspective, distorting it for emotional effect in order to evoke moods or ideas.
