


Baptism	One of the seven sacraments; sacrament of initiation through which people become members of the Church. It involves the use of water as a symbol of the washing away of sin.		Humanism	Humanists reject the idea or belief in a supernatural being such as God. This means that Humanists class themselves as agnostic or atheist. Humanists have no belief in an afterlife, and so they focus on seeking happiness in this life.	
Shahadah	For Sunni Muslims the Shahadah is: "There is no God but Allah and Muhammad is the Prophet of Allah." Shi'a Muslims add an extra phrase to the Shahadah: "And Ali is the friend of God."		Spiritualism	The doctrine that the spirit exists as distinct from matter, or that spirit is the only reality.	
Evangelism	Evangelism comes from the Greek words for the 'good news' or the Gospel and means to go to people who don't believe in Christ and tell them about Jesus and his teaching.		Census	In the census data, religion refers to a person's religious affiliation. This is the religion with which they connect or identify, rather than their beliefs or active religious practice.	
Mission	Mission comes from Latin, and means 'to be sent out' to do a task.		Generational displacement	Generational replacement is a theory proposed by Paul R. Abramson and Ronald Inglehart that attributes changes in values between young people and their elders to their different circumstances growing up	
Birth Rate	The birth rate is defined as the number of births per 1,000 of the population each year				

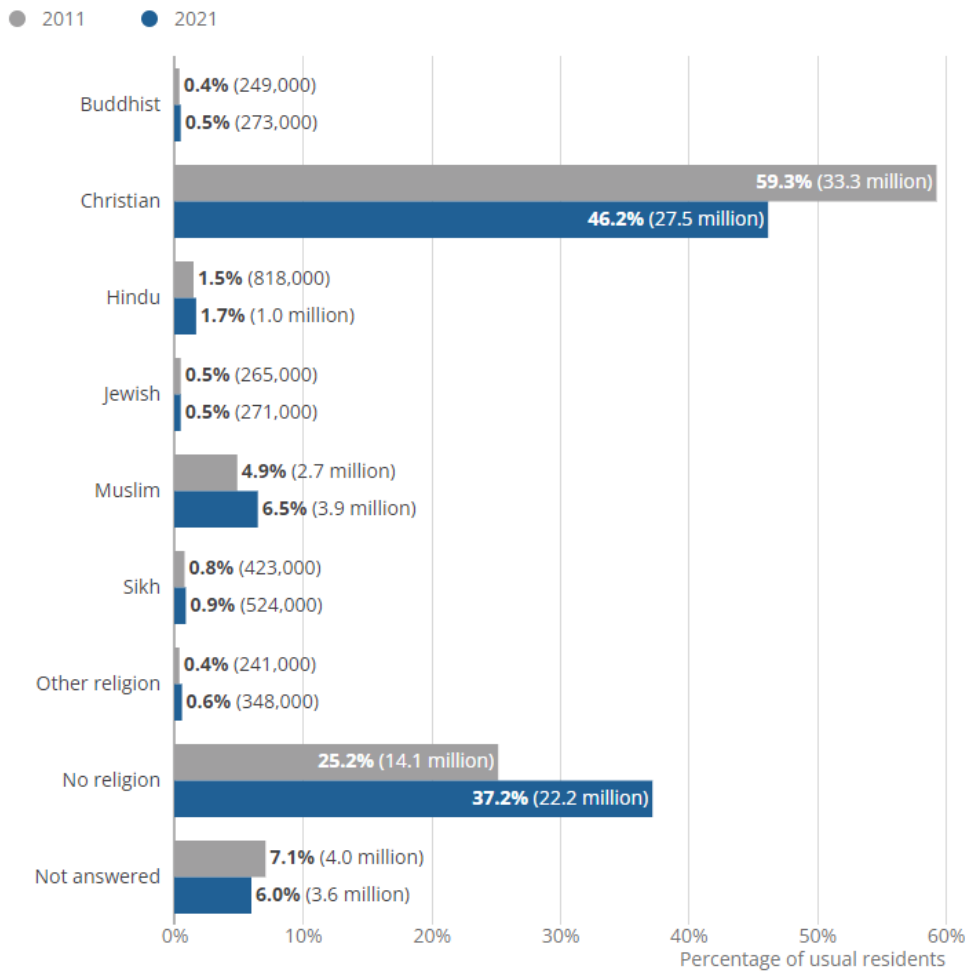

Religious growth in Tamworth / the UK in comparison to the world.

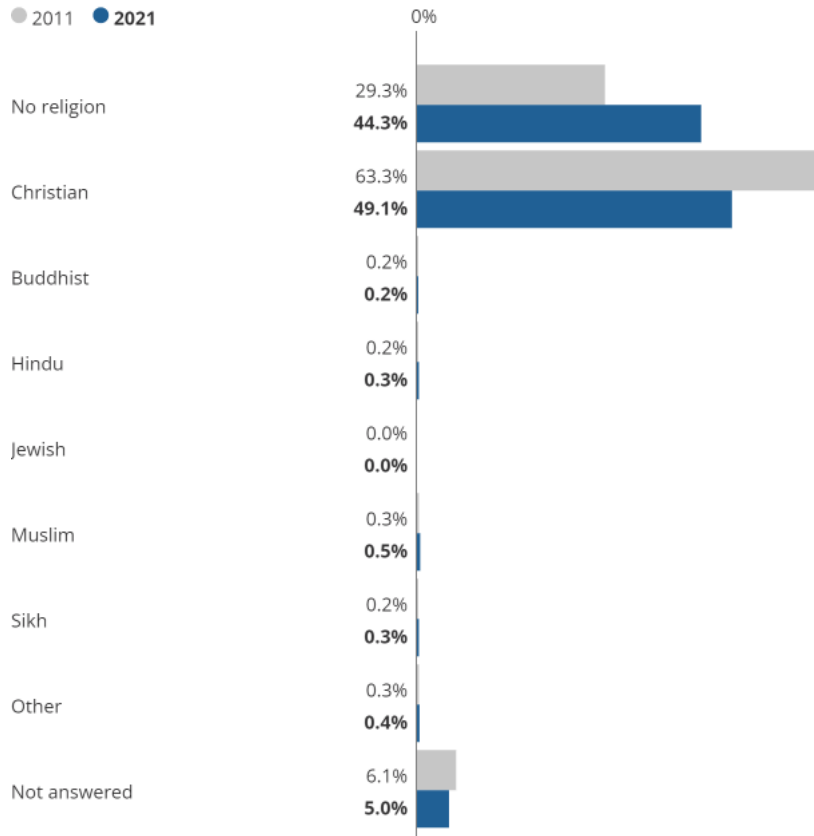
World 2011 vs 2021
