Should the UK still celebrate Christmas and Easter?

1	Incarnation	The belief that God took human form in Jesus Christ. It is also the belief that God in Christ is active in the Church and in the world.	
2	Prophecy	One of the literary forms found in the Bible, messages/revelation from God.	
3	Messiah	This means 'anointed'. In scripture, it's often a great King or leader descended from King David, whose purpose was to restore Israel.	
4	Good Friday	The day when Christians remember Jesus dying on the cross	
5	Resurrection	The Christian belief that Jesus rose from the dead on the third day after the crucifixion. The rising from the dead of believers on the Last Day in a new, or risen, life.	

6	Crucifixion	The death of Jesus; a form of the death penalty used by the Romans.	
7	Eid	Id-ul-Adha is the commemoration of sacrifice, while Id-ul-Fitr occurs at the end of Ramadan and is a day of thanksgiving to Allah	
8	Muhammad	Muhammad is the final prophet in Islam, known as the Seal of the Prophets.	
9	Jesus	The God of Christianity in human form. Jesus was a Jewish rather than Christian and was historically born around Christmas day.	
10	Fasting	The practise of abstaining from food	
11	Ramadan	The 9th month in the Islamic calendar. Muslims won't eat or drink during the hours of daylight
