	1	Exodus	The Exodus is when God freed the Jewish people from their enslavement in Egypt.	
	2	Miracle	A miracle is an extraordinary event that goes against nature, cannot be explained by science and is caused by God.	
	3	Enlightenment	A state of wisdom that enables total clarity and understanding of the truths of existence; achieving Enlightenment (Buddhahood) allows a being to be freed from the cycle of rebirth	
	4	The Buddha	Historically the Buddha (Siddhartha Gautama) An awakened or enlightened person.	
	5	Hinduism	A collection of the religion, culture, and philosophy of ancient India	35

6	Torah	Holy book/source of authority; the Jewish scriptures. Includes into three parts: Torah (Law), Nevi'im (prophets) and Ketuvim (writings).	
7	Bible	The Bible records the teachings of Jesus during his life. These teachings give Christians guidance and instructions on how to live their life.	+
8	Pali Canon	The scriptures written in the language Pali. Known as the 'three baskets' covering the life and teachings of the Buddha and Buddhist philosophy.	**
9	Moses	Moses was a Hebrew prophet, teacher and leader, according to Abrahamic tradition. Moses was Jewish rather than Christian.	
10	Siddhartha	Buddhism can be traced back to northern India approximately 2500 years ago to a man called Siddhartha Gautama.
