





Burial	Funeral rites are the traditional ceremonies associated in connection with burial or cremation. These rites vary across religious groups often with a specific set of rules for what to do.		Hell	Hell has traditionally been depicted as a place of eternal fire that symbolises pain and suffering. Hell is the opposite of Heaven – it is eternity in the absence of God.	
Cremation	The disposal of a dead person's body by burning it to ashes, typically after a funeral ceremony.		Purgatory	The Roman Catholic Church teaches that after death there is a state of Purgatory. This is a place where some people who have sinned are purified in a cleansing fire, after which they are accepted into Heaven.	
Sky Burial	Tibetan funeral ritual involving the exposure of a dismembered corpse to sacred vultures.		Karma/ Kamma	Karma is the idea that actions have consequences. One thing leads to another, so what is done today makes a difference tomorrow.	
Afterlife	A concept of life after death.		Rebirth/ Reincarnation	The religious belief that existence is a cycle of birth, life, death and rebirth, and that the soul survives physical death and is reborn in a new body	
Heaven	Heaven is described as eternity in the presence of God, as Heaven is a state of being rather than a physical place		Crucifixion	The death of Jesus; a form of the death penalty used by the Romans.	
Resurrection	Christians believe that 3 days after his crucifixion, Jesus rose from the dead and was eventually witnessed ascending back up to heaven.		Ascension	Going or being taken up; the event forty days after the resurrection when Jesus returned to glory in heaven	

Good Friday	Good Friday is the Friday before Easter Sunday when Christians remember Jesus' crucifixion		Easter Sunday	Easter is a celebration in the Spring which celebrates Jesus' resurrection from the dead.
