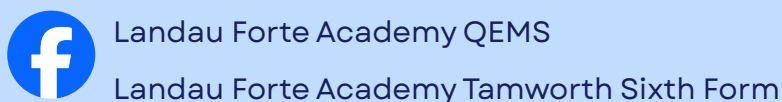
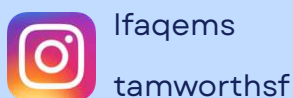

How Can I Protect My Child From Extremist Influences?

Being honest with your child and talking to them on a regular basis is the best way to help keep them safe. Remember that your child's safety extends to their online activity too.

Giving your child the facts will help them challenge extremist arguments. Extremist groups' use of internet and social media has become a prolific way for them to spread their ideology. To help keep your child safe:

- Talk to your child about staying safe online
- Keep an eye on the sites your child is visiting
- Use parental controls on browsers, games and social media to filter or monitor what your child can see

Remember that even young children may be exposed to extremism online. Trying to stop your child using the internet and mobile devices won't keep them safe. Instead, teach them to understand that just because something appears on a website doesn't mean it's factually correct.

As a parent, it's likely you'll recognise factors or changes in behaviour before anyone else, and will be able to use your judgement to know whether your child is vulnerable to radicalisation. The following behaviours are a guide and it's important to remember that anyone can be affected by extremism:

- Struggling with a sense of identity
- Distanced from their cultural or religious background
- Difficulty fitting in with British culture
- Questioning their place in society
- Family issues
- Experiencing a traumatic event
- Experiencing racism or discrimination
- Difficulty in interacting socially, lacking empathy or not understanding the consequences of their actions
- Low self-esteem

Any of these issues make children more susceptible to believing that extremists' claims are the answer to their problems.

External factors play their part too, such as: community tension, events affecting the country or region where they or their parents are from, or having friends or family who have joined extremist groups. Exposure to one-sided points of view all contribute to the process of radicalisation.

Fake News' Disinformation and Misinformation

The growth of the online space and the influence it has on our daily lives means that we are now receiving our news in different ways, such as through social media posts, online news outlets, and digital apps and platforms.

Disinformation is information that is not true and is shared and created with the intent to deceive and mislead. In contrast, misinformation is information that is not true, but it shared and created without the intent to mislead.

'Fake news' is a term commonly used to describe disinformation and misinformation that is being presented and shared as reputable news.

Misinformation and disinformation are utilised by a range of individuals and organisations, including political groups and extremists. They can use technology to make their content look like it has come from a trusted source and is backed up by factual evidence, and they can create numerous social media accounts to spread disinformation across the internet, making the content go viral. Through the use of things like predictive algorithms, these views can be spread directly to individuals who are most likely to spread and reinforce those messages.

Misinformation and disinformation can mislead learners, leading to a range of potential harms – including spreading hatred, intolerance, and mistrust. Extremists utilise disinformation, misinformation, and conspiracy theories to help gain increased exposure for their ideas, as well as attracting those with personal grievances who may be susceptible to their hateful narratives.

Mental Health Support Team

Landau Forte QEMS are supported by the Mental Health Support Team (MHST), which is a team specifically designed to work within schools. Working within MHSTs are Education Mental Health Practitioners (EMHPs) and Children Wellbeing Practitioners (CWPs). EMHPs are trained to offer specific interventions to students who are experiencing mild to moderate mental health and emotional wellbeing difficulties. These low intensity interventions, based on the CBT model, help young people to understand the links between thoughts, actions and feelings (physical and emotional). In so doing, we guide students to understand how to break unhelpful cycles (of thought or actions) that may be maintaining their difficulty. Sessions are confidential unless safeguarding concerns arise.

We advise school and/or parents on where to signpost students when the type of intervention offered by MHST would not meet the needs of an individual.

The main presentations we support are:

- anxiety
- low mood
- panic
- phobia
- exam stress

The MHST also supports the Whole School Approach to mental health.

We offer assemblies, workshops, drop-ins and staff training on a number of issues relating to mental health and wellbeing. We also liaise with key members of the pastoral team and aim to give timely advice and signposting.

CAREERS

The UCAS Discovery event can help students to find out about traditional degrees, apprenticeships, careers, and more. The aim of a Discovery event is to help students decide on your next steps. At the event, students will have the opportunity to:

- chat to universities and colleges about their courses and university life
- speak to employers and apprenticeship providers about what an apprenticeship looks like and the options available
- speak to qualified careers advisers about your future
- listen to talks from experts in their fields
- hang out with our UCAS experts to get dedicated support about your options.

Year 7 and 8 students, supported by Isobel Windridge (Year 12), attended the University of Staffordshire this term to participate in a 'Girls in IT' day. This included interactive talks in the eSports arena, Networking, Virtual Production, Radio Broadcasting, Motion Capture and Robotics before the students presented a 'Dragons Den' style pitch on how they would utilise AI and Technology to solve a real world problem.



PSHE SPOTLIGHT



It has been a busy half term for the students in PSHE. Alongside our usual lessons and assemblies, we had external speakers 'Step in, Speak Up' undertake workshops with our Year 8 and 9 students about how to be active bystanders and be aware of violence against women and girls.

In our PSHE lessons we have been looking at a number of different topics. Please also see links to websites that you can use to support the students if they have any further questions after our PSHE lessons.

Year 7 have been looking at protected characteristics and are moving onto the topic of finance, looking at how to budget and the different types of financial products available.

The QEMS girls suffered a narrow 2-1 defeat to Codsall Middle School in the County Cup Final, marking the school's first ever girls' final. Despite the result, the team produced a performance full of character, determination, and quality that everyone can be proud of.

QEMS started the game brightly, winning tackles, moving the ball forward and creating several opportunities through excellent passages of play. Their strong start was rewarded with the opening goal following a brilliantly worked corner routine between Zara and Aubree, with captain Zara firing into the top corner to give QEMS a deserved 1-0 lead. The girls continued to dominate large periods of the first half, with Zara, Aubree and Jayda controlling the midfield battle and driving the team forward. Codsall's main threat came through a series of long throw-ins, but the QEMS defence dealt with them superbly for much of the game. Unfortunately, Codsall found an equaliser just before half-time after a loose ball broke through the defence, allowing their striker to level the match.

Codsall started the second half strongly, but QEMS matched them across every area. The improvement shown by the girls was incredible, especially considering the heavy defeat suffered in the previous meeting between the two sides. This time, QEMS took the game to their opponents and showed no fear on the biggest stage. As the pressure continued from both teams, Codsall eventually took the lead following another long throw and a quick reaction from their striker inside the box to make it 2-1. QEMS refused to give up and pushed relentlessly for an equaliser. Important saves from the Codsall goalkeeper, near misses and the crossbar denied the girls what would have been a deserved equaliser. Every single player gave absolutely everything until the final whistle, but it wasn't enough as Codsall were crowned County Cup Champions.

To compete so strongly against a strong side is a huge testament to the girls' desire, dedication, and hard work. The coaches could not be prouder of this group of players, and after such an inspiring cup run, the team will no doubt be aiming to go one step further next year.

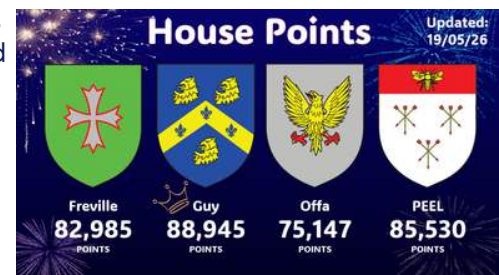
We were also delighted to be joined by our very special guests:

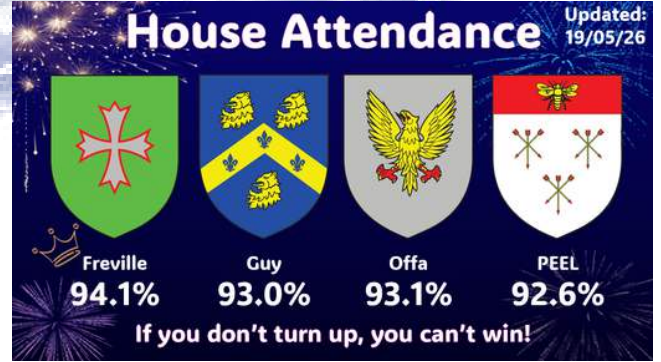
